### **Toddler I Curriculum**

Our youngest children learn to become comfortable and feel safe in their new pre-school environment. Children are well cared for and nurtured.

Below is an outline of the key elements included designed to meet the following areas of development:

1. Socialization
2. Emotional
3. Cognitive
4. Physical

---

#### **1. SOCIALIZATION**

- Free play in learning centers
- Learning to take turns
- Informal circle time
- Modeling of behavior
- Learning each other's names (as well as recognition of their peers' parents, babysitters, etc.)
- Learning to anticipate activities by reinforcement of transition times
- Art activities with two children and a teacher
- Self-help – snacks, lunch, using a spoon, washing hands, etc.
- Self-Help Skills
- Creative Expression
- Developing appropriate conflict resolution skills

#### **2. EMOTIONAL**

- Self-awareness
- Validation and naming of emotions
- Smooth transition from one activity to the next
- Positive reinforcement and praise

#### **3. COGNITIVE**

##### **a. LANGUAGE DEVELOPMENT**

- Books, stories, rhymes, fingerplays and flannel board stories
- Using open ended questions
- Singing
- Exploration of colors

##### **b. MATH**

- Counting to 3
- Number concepts – big/little, more/less
- Exploration of shapes

##### **c. SCIENCE**

- Animals
- Seasons
- Weather

- Senses
- Body Awareness
- Cooking

#### 4. PHYSICAL

##### a. GROSS MOTOR

- The Climber
- Gym and Creative Movement Classes
- Outdoor play

##### b. FINE MOTOR

- Arts & Crafts
- Cooking – mixing, stirring
- Manipulatives – blocks, puzzles
- Cooking
- Musical Instruments
